The 27th QTIC Salute to Excellence Awards acknowledge outstanding secondary students, employers, schools, and registered training organisations for their participation in and contribution to the tourism, food and beverage, and cookery qualifications through VETiS, and School-Based Apprenticeship(s) or Traineeship(s).

The program highlights the importance of vocational education and training among secondary schools across Queensland and demonstrates the industry's commitment to its workforce and aspiring future leaders.

The QTIC Salute to Excellence Awards recognise pathways and career opportunities within the tourism and hospitality industry for secondary students and provides multiple opportunities for students to network with employers.

ELIGIBILITY

To nominate for the award the applicant must:

- Be a *tourism or hospitality business* in Queensland.
- Provide School Based Traineeship or Apprenticeship employment opportunities to secondary students completing qualifications within the <u>SIT Training Package</u>.
- A secondary school or registered training provider must endorse all applicants they currently provide opportunities to.
- Online Submissions cannot exceed the 500-word limit and 2,000-character limit for each response.
- Documents that can be uploaded include .JPG, .jpeg, .png, .pdf, .doc., each file cannot exceed 50mb.

NOMINATION PROCESS

Nominees will be required to complete the two-step nomination process online using the link below: https://www.judgify.me/Salute2024

- Step 1: Complete Entrant Form Online
- Step 2: Complete Submission Online

SELECTION CRITERIA

This award category requires the applicant to address the following award criteria:

CRITERION 1: EXTENT AND QUALITY OF TRAINING - WEIGHT (30%)

Consider:

- Outline your involvement in designing or developing training specifically for secondary students, either alone or in partnership with a training provider and/or school.
- Outline the amount of time (on average per month) that your business spends in training activities for secondary students.
- How do you integrate on-the-job and off-the-job training for secondary students?
- How many secondary students have you employed as a school-based trainee or apprentice since 1 January 2021?
- Outline what qualifications they completed or were completing.

Online Submission:

500-word limit/2,000-character limit.

CRITERION 2: ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE BUSINESS, OR OF ITS EMPLOYEES, WHICH IS ATTRIBUTED TO TRAINING - WEIGHT (20%)

Consider:

- How do you measure the benefits of training?
- How will training secondary students improve your business in the future?
- Outline how training secondary students has provided benefits to your business.
- Outline how training secondary students has provided benefits to your staff.

Online Submission:

• 500-word limit/2,000-character limit.

CRITERION 3: INTEGRATION OF TRAINING INTO BUSINESS PLANNING- WEIGHT (20%)

Consider:

- Outline the purpose and expected outcomes from integrating school-based trainees/ apprentices into your businesses.
- How do you identify a school-based training opportunity in your business?

Online Submission:

• 500-word limit/2,000-character limit.

CRITERION 4: COMMITMENT TO EQUITY IN TRAINING- WEIGHT (30%)

Consider:

- Identify training opportunities that your business has provided to secondary students from groups often under-represented such as.
 - o People with disabilities; or
 - o Indigenous people; or
 - o People from a non-English speaking background.

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 How many people have undertaken training programs within your business from the abovementioned groups?

Online Submission:

• 500-word limit/2,000-character limit.

TOTAL WEIGHT - 100%

• Nominees must receive a total score of 50% or above to be an eligible finalist.

JUDGING PROCESS

1ST ROUND JUDGING

QTIC will receive all applications and once nominations have closed, judges will be provided access to their category online. The judges will then review the nominations for their category and place a score against each category. The Judging Panel consists of six judges, two per category, from industry. The panel will shortlist finalists for each category based on completed submissions.

2ND ROUND JUDGING

Shortlisted finalists will be invited to participate in second round of judging that will consist of:

• A virtual interview through an online platform,

The online interview will be conducted by two judges in the relevant category on Monday, 24 June 2024. A QTIC team member will contact the finalists to schedule the virtual interview.

Category winners will be announced at the Salute to Excellence Awards Dinner event being held on Monday, 29 July 2024. Further information will be provided to finalists.
